

Surgical and Anesthesia Release Form

To make your pet's anesthetic procedure as safe as possible we would like you to read and understand the following information:

- With all surgical procedures it is important your pet has fasted. If your pet has eaten or you are not sure if your pet has eaten it is important for you to be aware that there could be complications such as aspiration.
- Before putting your pet under anesthesia, we will perform a brief physical exam. Many conditions such as disorders of the liver, kidneys, and blood are not detected unless blood testing is performed. Therefore, we recommend blood screening before any surgical procedure.
